One of the best loved and most acclaimed Finnish designers - Paavo Tynell was born in Helsinki, Finland, in 1890. He was an industrial designer, often referred to as 'the man who illuminated Finland' through his world-renowned and extremely sought-after work,

formed mostly from perforated and polished brass. He was a true pioneer of Nordic lighting design, with his early work proving to be of a functionalist nature during the first stages of his awe-inspiring career. His works today are some of the most coveted collectors items in Nordic lighting design.
