In 1928, Aino and Alvar Aalto established a professional relationship with renowned Danish designer. That same year, Henningsen's signature ceiling lights were commissioned for the interior of Lounais-Suomen Maalaistentalo (Southwest Finland Landbo House). Additionally, the Aaltos integrated one of Henningsen's distinctive red ceiling lamps into their
