Birch frame, black linoleum shelving, and white lacquered wooden wheels.

This rare trolley "model 901" has large white wheels and contrasting black surfaces. Its laminated sides bend into a closed curve. The linoleum covering of the two shelves is practical and allows for teacups, glasses, or bottles to be placed on top without leaving marks or stains. The trolley is a significant design collectable by Finland's most acclaimed architect and designer Alvar Aalto who first presented it at the 1936 Milan Triennial.

Alvar Aalto loved clean curves and bends, which he often integrated into his architecture and furniture designs.

He is frequently referred to as "the modern master of the curve and sinuosity."
